Section 3 - Hazards Identification

Emergency Overview: Use ventilation necessary to keep exposures below recommended exposure limits, if any. May cause irritation to the respiratory tract.

Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures

Steps To Be Taken If Material Is Released Or Spilled: Use personal protective equipment as necessary. Dispose of material in accordance with all federal, state and local regulations. If a spill or leak occurs, contain the material. It can be allowed to dry or cure and presents no health or fire hazard. The material can then be removed and disposed of as non-hazardous waste. Before drying, the material can be washed or removed using soap and water.

Section 7 - Handling And Storage

Handling: Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Wear personal protection equipment. Do not breathe vapors. Wash thoroughly after handling. Use only in accordance with Carboline application instructions, container label and Product Data Sheet.
